IX RESEARCH

Project Scale-up Experience

1. Expansion of EOC Services

I served as consultant to develop the national training manual and curriculum for FP/ RH for various cadre of health professionals- midwives, Community Health Extension Workers (Chews) and Physicians. These were used (tested) in selected locations before it was finalized.

Training was conducted in few LGAs in a couple of states and up scaled to other LGAs and States. Training are on-going in Kebbi, Sokoto and Katsina States.

National Breastfeeding Program

- 2. I served as a National trainer and resource person for the Nigerian Exclusive Breastfeeding Program 1991- 2000. Zonal/State trainers were developed and facilitated for the subsequent training at LGA and Health Facility levels.

3. National Program on Strengthening Strategic Leadership and Management

This is a current initiative at building leadership and management capacity at all levels of healthcare including the household. Thirty National Trainers were trained by faculty from GI/JHU and the step down training is on-going. By 26 June- 1st July 2005, Parliamentarians from the House and Senate will be participating in a DFID/PATH supported program aiming to build Champions with credible voice to advocate for reform in the health sector, particularly in support of RH. This activity is in collaboration with FMOH,GI/JHU, JHUCCP and the Center for Population and Reproductive Health, University of Ibadan.
